

Our Aims

It is our aim that everyone involved with our school community feels valued and respected and that each person is treated fairly and well. At Thurcroft Infants, we promote a happy, safe and secure environment where everyone feels just that.

Good Behaviour and Rewards

We have Golden Rules and a home school agreement which we expect children to follow in the children's diaries. We reward good behaviour to develop an attitude that respecting others, being kind and working as part of a team, is the correct and positive attitude to have. We expect our children to treat all adults and children with respect. We also encourage the older pupils to set a good example for the younger ones, by helping at dinner times etc.

Green Cards

We often show positive behaviour by awarding green cards. When a child has collected 10 green cards as recorded by their teacher, they will get to see Mrs Harper for a prize!



Special Mentions

We share special achievements that the children have made in our Special Mentions assembly. If your child is sharing their special piece of work or achievement, you will be invited to attend the assembly.

Awards

Children will be rewarded with stickers for good attitude to work in class, which go on a special chart. These add up to Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards to be presented to the children by Mrs Harper.



Raffle Tickets

Raffle tickets are awarded by the staff at playtimes and lunchtimes for positive behaviour. These are entered into a weekly draw and the winning ticket wins a prize!



Sanctions

Sometimes it is required to take action to enforce the school rules are being followed. This is as a last resort to ensure a safe learning environment.



Red Cards

Red cards are recorded in a red book in Mrs Harpers office and the parents/guardians will be informed so that positive steps can be made. If your child receives 10 red cards, you will be asked to attend a meeting to discuss the situation.

An immediate red card will be given for bullying and for any physical contact or injury.

In the Classroom

If a child is not listening to instructions they will be asked to move closer to the teacher or to sit on their own. A disruptive child may need to be removed if he/she has been asked by the teacher previously to calm down. This is only until they can rejoin the class to work sensibly. The school expects children to try their best in activities, and if not, we may ask them to redo a task.

Bullying


Thurcroft Infants does not tolerate bullying and action will be immediately taken to stop further bullying.

Restraint Regulations

All staff are aware of regulations regarding force to control or restrain pupils and will only intervene in such a way to prevent injury to a child or if a child is in danger. All actions meet government guidelines on the matter to ensure the safety of our pupils.

We would encourage all parents to work with the school to promote good behaviour. This only enforces your child's learning and leads to a happier and safer environment for all children.

Parents will be informed if there are concerns about behaviour, and vice versa parents are encouraged to raise their concerns with Mrs Harper.
